Mrs. Jane Kiungu started her career in Zevet Kenya an Architecheral firm which designed Co Operative Bank Building (the bell-bottom House). She later moved to CNA and finally to Sound City/Parker Radio where she diligently worked for 22 years until her retirement in December 2015.

ILLNESS & FINISHING THE RACE

In 2005, When Jane was first diagnosed with Breast cancer, She took the news bravely. She went through a masectomy, radiotherapy and chemotherapy and she was determined to fight the disease and win. At the time, Jane did not have grandchildren and always had the wish to live long to see her grandchildren and by the grace of God, She did win. She managed her illness and lived for 14 years cancer free and during these years God blessed her with her lovely grandchildren with whom she shared many happy and productive years.

In 2019, Jane was diagnosed with Stage 4 metastatic bone cancer. She went to India for treatment where she stayed for a month and underwent Radiotherapy and was put on Hormonal Therapy treatment. In September 2020 Jane's situation got worse and she got admitted to Nairobi Womens Hospital and later to KU referral hospital. Even though her health deteriorated, her spirit was very strong.

Jane was fortunate to celebrate her 62nd birthday on the 12th of October 2020 with her family at hospital. On the 13th of October, Jane got discharged from hospital as she wanted nothing more than to spend more time with her family at home and make sure that her mother was well taken care of. One week later on Monday, her health deteriorated and on the 18th of October, Jane was readmitted back to hospital.

On her last night, 22nd October 2020, Jane spent her final hours with her immediate family by her side. When she passed on, the family was devastated but took comfort knowing that she was with her Creator and most of all she had been relived the pain she was going through.

Jane was passionate about helping and supporting people, and was often the sweet and happy face in every crowd. Whenever people were looking for guidance or needed support they knew they could ask Jane.

Jane had many friends of all ages. Even in retirement, she would have an endless stream of friends and family dropping in. Even kids in her neighbourhood would come over to her and Basil's house and always referred to her as their cucu.

Her life had many obstacles, and she struggled with a devastating illness. Yet through it all, her love and caring for her family remained her focus, and in so many, many ways, she was able to show that love to us. This perseverance through adversity is a powerful lesson for us, and I believe it is her legacy. What a wonderful lesson she gave us. Don't let adversities or setbacks or any of the distractions of the world keep you from this most important aspect of life. Jane was very selfless. She touched the lives of family, and friends by putting the needs of others first. What can be more important than loving and showing your love for your family and friends? How can some of us who are blessed with so much forget to be thankful to God, while somehow Jane kept her faith through all of her trials. This is a wonderful example to follow. Keep focused on what is truly important, not only when your life is easy, but when it is difficult too.

This family, and her role as a daughter, a sibling, a wife, a mother and grand-mother, was the most important thing to Jane. This is where she drew her strength and left her legacy.

The love she showed to all of us will live on and be with us even now that she has gone to be with God.

My lasting memories of Jane are simple: a gentle, generous, compassionate figure of strength who never waned in her support or love of her family and friends, and who soldiered on, even when times were tough.

On behalf of myself and rest of the family, I'd like to thank you all for coming here today.

It is a great privilege to write this eulogy to express the sadness that all of us here today share over her loss. Jane, thank you for everything you've given us — and the warmth we shared during your precious time on earth.






















Amazing grace
